### 1. Event Overview

The Deaflympics, combining “Deaf” and “Olympics,” is an international Olympic event for the deaf and hard of hearing. Organized by the International Committee of Sports for the Deaf (ICSD), this international multi-sport event is held every four years for deaf athletes. The first Deaflympics was held in Paris, France, in 1924. The TOKYO 2025 DEAFLYMPICS marks the 100th anniversary of the event and will be the first time it is held in Japan.
